GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All Cal Grant award offers are subject to the approval of the final state budget.

California Dream Act allows undocumented and documented students who meet the nonresident tuition exemption eligibility requirements to:

- apply for and receive non-state funded scholarships for public colleges and universities
- apply for and receive state-funded financial aid such as Cal Grant, Middle Class Scholarship, Chafee Grant, CCC fee waiver and institutional grant

Additional requirements:	Completion of the G-6 Transfer Entitlement Certification Form, if identified as potentially eligible	
Population served:	Students who graduated from a California high school or its equivalent during or after the 2000-01 academic year; were California residents when they graduated high school (unless that California resident graduated outside of California due to military orders); OR non-high school graduates or its equivalent that were a California resident at the age of 18; have at least a 2.4 CCC GPA; must transfer in the same academic year as awarded and receive award payment at an eligible institution offering a baccalaureate degree; must be under the age of 28 by December 31 of award year

CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENTITLEMENT AWARDS		
Application deadline:	September 2, 2022	
Additional requirements:	Must be on an Enrollment File at a California Community College (CCC)	
Population served:	Students who were not awarded a Cal Grant A or B award at the time of the student's high school graduation but who will be enrolled at a California Community College during the award year and who meet all the general Cal Grant eligibility requirements. In lieu of a high school GPA, applicants may submit a College or CCC GPA (at least 2.4 on a 4.0 scale for a Cal Grant A; 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for Cal Grant B) or can re-establish their GPA by completing at least 16 units of credit at CCC with at least a 2.0 GPA, as defined by CSAC regulations.

COMPETITIVE CAL GRANT A and B REQUIREMENTS (limited number of awards)		
Application deadlines:	March 2, 2022	
Population served:	Non-CCC students not offered a Cal Grant Entitlement Award	
Selection criteria:	Special consideration given to disadvantaged students; factors include the expected family contribution, family income and household size, GPA, years since high school graduation, and other conditions that might hinder a student's access to higher education	
Number of new awards:	13,000 authorized awards.	

CAL GRANT C AWARD REQUIREMENTS (limited number of awards)	
Application deadline:	September 2, 2022
Population served:	Students from low and middle-income families who are seeking an occupational or technical training
Number of new awards:	7,761 authorized, unless adjusted in the Annual State Budget Bill
Additional requirements:	Completion of the C Supplement Form, if identified as potentially eligible
STUDENTS WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN (SWD)	
Population served:	Students attending a UC, CSU, CCC, or private non-profit institution who have dependent children under the age of 18 by July 1, 2022, for whom they provide more than half of their support during the academic year.
Award Amount:	Access award up to \$6,000 for qualifying Cal Grant A and B recipients and up to \$4,000 for eligible Cal Grant C recipients.
FOSTER YOUTH ACCESS AWARD (FYA) – CAL GRANT EXPANSION	
Population served:	A current and former foster youth student attending a UC, CSU, CCC, or private non-profit institution who is a person in California whose dependency was established or continued by the court on or after the youth’s 16th birthday and who is no older than 25 years of age at the commencement of the academic year.
Award Amount:	Access award up to \$6,000 for qualifying new and renewal Cal Grant A and B recipients and up to \$4,000 for eligible Cal Grant C recipients.
