#### What are Cal Grants?

**Cal Grant A:** provides tuition & fee assistance to low-and middle-income students. Eligibility is based on financial need and academic qualifications. Maximum awards for new recipients ranged from \$2,520 to \$9,708.

**Cal Grant B:** provides access allowance and tuition & fee assistance to disadvantaged and low-income students. Eligibility is based on financial need and academic qualifications. The "Access" allowance was \$1,551. Tuition & fee awards for new recipients ranged from \$2,520 to \$9,708.

**Cal Grant C:** provides assistance with tuition & fees and training-related costs to vocationally oriented low-and middle-income students. Eligibility is based on financial need. The allowance for training-related costs is \$576. Tuition & fee awards are up to \$2,592.

### EARLY ACADEMIC OUTREACH

#### California Student Opportunity and Access Program (Cal SOAP)

The Commission awards block grants to consortia of educational institutions in 17 areas of the state. Each consortium provides academic preparation and postsecondary information services to secondary school students.

- 135,000 students and parents served
- \$8.5 million total program funding

### SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

#### Law Enforcement Personnel Dependents Scholarship

Provides need-based educational grants to dependents and spouses of California peace officers, Corrections and Youth Authority employees, and public firefighters who have been killed or 100 percent disabled in the line of duty.

- 11 recipients
- \$82,000 total paid

#### Robert C. Byrd Scholarship

Provides federal scholarships of \$1,500, renewable for up to four years of postsecondary study, to graduating high school seniors who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement. Recipients may attend postsecondary institutions throughout the United States.

- 3,769 recipients
- \$5.5 million total paid

#### Child Development Teacher and Supervisor Grant Program

Offers up to \$2,000 grants per academic year to students studying child development. Community college students may receive two years of funding. Students transferring to a four-year institution to continue their studies may reapply for an additional two years.

- 290 recipients
- \$304,000 total paid

#### California Chafee Grant Program

The California Chafee Grant Program, also known as the Education and Training Voucher (ETV), is a federally funded program that provides grants to current or former foster youth to use for college or career and technical training. The Commission administers this program under contract with the Department of Social Services.

- 2,897 recipients
- \$14.5 million total paid\*

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### LOAN ASSUMPTION PROGRAMS

#### Assumption Program of Loans for Education (APLE)

The APLE program targets prospective K-12 teachers. Participants receive a commitment from the state to make future loan payments, up to \$19,000, upon successful fulfillment of required teaching service. 5,939 APLE awards were issued.

- 5,773 new program participants at 80 California postsecondary institutions; 124 District Intern program participants; 42 County Office of Education for recruiting Out of State Teachers
- \$36.5 million in loan assumption payments were made in 2006-2007 on loans for 12,056 participants who completed qualified teaching service during 2005-2006 (payments are made **after** completion of each year of service).

#### Graduate Assumption Program of Loans for Education (Grad APLE)

The Grad APLE program targets prospective postsecondary teachers. No funding was authorized for new awards.

- \$90,000 in loan assumption payments were made for 46 participants with remaining eligibility..

#### Assumption Program of Loans for Education for Nurses in State Facilities (SNAPLE NSF)

The SNAPLE NSF program is intended to encourage registered nurses and students who will become registered nurses to seek employment in state-operated 24-hour facilities with an a registered nurse vacancy rate greater than 10%. After four years of satisfactory employment service, participants will receive up to \$20,000 in loan assumption payments over three years.

- 5 new program participants

#### Assumption Program of Loans for Education for Nursing Faculty (SNAPLE NF)

The SNAPLE NF program is intended to encourage students to complete a baccalaureate or graduate degree and teach in a nursing program at a regionally accredited California college or university. After three years of satisfactory teaching service, participants will receive up to \$25,000 in loan assumption payments.

- 62 new program participants

#### National Guard Assumption Program of Loans for Education (NGAPLE)

The NGAPLE program provides an incentive for persons to enlist or reenlist in the National Guard, the State Military Reserve, or the Naval Militia. After four years of satisfactory military service, participants will receive up to \$11,000 in loan assumption payments.

- 100 new program participants

### FEDERAL FAMILY EDUCATION LOAN PROGRAM

The Commission/EdFund guaranteed 1,649,107 loans in state fiscal year 2006-2007, with a total volume over \$9.6 billion, including consolidations. These totals represent an increase of 9.8% in the number of loans, and a 5.3% increase in loan dollars from 2005-2006.
