# Cal Grant

## Competitive Program

*This document displays data about the 2013-14 Competitive Cal Grant A and B offered awardees. It also includes data for students who filed their application on time and were financially eligible but did not receive an award (eligible non-offered awardees).*


**Under Senate Bill 1644** (Chapter 403, Statutes of 2000), California students who do not receive an Entitlement Cal Grant A or B award may compete for 22,500 Competitive Cal Grant A and B awards. These awards are not entitlements.

Schools or postsecondary institutions seeking to participate in the Cal Grant Program must meet various statutory eligibility requirements, including a federal student loan three-year Cohort Default Rate threshold and a graduation rate threshold.

Fifty percent of the Competitive Cal Grant A and B awards are available to all students who meet the eligibility criteria and apply by the March 2<sup>nd</sup> Cal Grant application deadline. The remaining fifty percent are reserved for students who will be enrolled at a California Community College and apply by the September 2<sup>nd</sup> Cal Grant application deadline.

The data in this document reflect the 2013-14 Competitive Cal Grants offered to qualified applicants who applied by one or both deadlines and received awards (offered awardees) or were financially eligible to receive an award (eligible non-offered awardees). A qualified applicant may be attending or planning to attend an eligible Cal Grant participating institution.



# Competitive Cal Grant A

**Award requirements** include financial and basic eligibility and a minimum 3.0 high school grade point average (GPA) or a minimum 2.4 college GPA. Cal Grant A awards provide for full systemwide fees at the California State University and the University of California, as well as tuition support at independent California colleges and universities and private career colleges. Of these Cal Grant A awards, 964 were made for the March 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline, while 34 percent, or 503 awards, were made for the September 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline.


Cal Grant A Offered Awardees by School Segment



Competitive Cal Grant A and B Offered Awardees by Income




# Competitive Cal Grant B

**Award requirements** include financial and basic eligibility and a minimum 2.0 GPA. Cal Grant B awards provide up to \$1,473 for books and living expenses for first-year students. Beginning with the recipient's second year of attendance, Cal Grant B awards also help pay for tuition and fees at public or independent four-year colleges or other qualifying institutions. Of these Cal Grant B awards, 13,868 were made for the March 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline, while 50 percent, or 13,635 awards, were made for the September 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline.



### Cal Grant B Offered Awardees by Gender



# Competitive Cal Grant Eligible Non-Offered Awardees

**Applicants must meet multiple criteria to qualify.** Submitting both the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the Cal Grant GPA Verification Form is the first step for students to be considered for a Competitive Cal Grant. For 2013-14, over 301,000 students were successful in meeting the financial and basic eligibility criteria. Additional eligibility criteria may include a disadvantaged high school experience, an orphan or ward of the court status and the size of the applicant's family relative to household income. Of the qualified students, about 10 percent received awards. Nearly 272,500 qualified students remained unserved.





- Cal Grant C offered awardees and eligible non-offered awardees

Data are reported by the type of financial aid application filed, either a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a California Dream Act Application, and by segment.

The average GPA data for Cal Grant C offered awardees and eligible non-offered awardees are an average of the reported GPAs.
