PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE MEETING

No person may be required, as a condition to attendance at a meeting of a state body, to register his or her name, to provide other information, to

complete a questionnaire, or otherwise to fulfill any condition precedent to his or her attendance. If such information is requested, effective notice shall be given that such information is not required as a condition of admittance to the meeting. (CA Gov. Code, Section 11124.)

In order to gain admittance to these posted meetings conducted on these premises, guests are required to identify themselves to the guards. Arrangements should be made to allow free public access to the meeting facility. In the alternative, the public must be advised that compliance with the security procedures is voluntary. If the guest refuses to comply, the guest will have to be admitted despite noncompliance under some alternative security strategy.
