

The California Student Aid Commission (Commission) is pleased to announce the beginning of the 2009-2010 APLE application and selection cycle. The Commission is distributing 7,200 allocations among California's 82 participating postsecondary institutions for the 2009-2010 academic year.

The priority filing date for submitting applications is **December 1, 2009**. The Commission will continue to accept applications if unused allocations are available until June 30, 2010.

## 2009-2010 COORDINATOR'S GUIDE

Please refer to the following guidelines when reviewing, selecting, and submitting 2009-2010 APLE applications.

### PROGRAM INFORMATION

The APLE is a competitive teacher incentive program designed to attract and retain outstanding students into California's teaching profession.

Under the provisions of the basic APLE, the Commission may assume up to \$11,000\* in outstanding educational loans in return for four consecutive years of full-time eligible teaching service in a California K-12 public school. Participants must teach in either:

- ◆ A designated subject-shortage area identified annually by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Current subject-shortage areas include: math, science, business, foreign language, agriculture and education specialist instruction (formerly, special education), or
- ◆ Schools serving a large population of students from low-income families as designated by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, or
- ◆ State special schools, schools serving rural areas, low-performing schools in the bottom 20 percentile of the Academic Performance Index (API), and/or schools having a high percentage of teachers holding emergency permits.

*\*APLE participants who agree to provide teaching service in math, science, or education specialist instruction in a school ranked in the lowest 60 percentile of the API may receive up to \$1,000 of additional loan assumption benefits each year. Another annual \$1,000 of benefits may be received by persons teaching math, science, or education specialist instruction in a school ranked in the lowest 20 percentile of the API for a maximum total of \$19,000.*

Each year the Commission distributes 7,200 APLE applications to participating institutions. Each institution receives a minimum of one application. The remaining applications are distributed among eligible institutions based on the number of teacher candidates from each institution who were fully credentialed during the previous year, as reported by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC).

All applicants must sign a Loan Assumption Agreement (LAA). The LAA stipulates that the Commission will authorize loan assumption payments if the participant (a) provides four consecutive years of service in the teaching area indicated on the LAA and (b) complies with all other program requirements. **The teaching service area on the LAA cannot be changed without the written approval of the Commission.**

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

New applicants must meet the following criteria:

- ◆ Be a U.S. citizen, or eligible non-citizen.
- ◆ Have completed a minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter units prior to the 2009-2010 fall term.
- ◆ Be enrolled in a program leading to a baccalaureate degree or in an approved program of professional teacher preparation through at least the end of the 2009-2010 fall term.
- ◆ Be enrolled each term at least half-time in coursework required for a baccalaureate degree or an initial teaching credential.
- ◆ Have received, or been approved to receive, an educational loan to meet the costs associated with obtaining a baccalaureate degree or an initial teaching credential, through one or more of the following loan programs: the Federal Family Educational Loan program, Federal Direct Student Loan program, Federal Perkins Loan, or privately funded institutional education loans.
- ◆ Be in good standing with repayment of any state or federally funded educational grants and state or federally insured educational loans.
- ◆ Not have completed the coursework necessary to obtain an initial teaching credential. An initial teaching credential is defined as a preliminary or clear multiple or single subject teaching credential.

### EDUCATION SPECIALIST CREDENTIALS:

In addition to the Education Specialist Instruction Credential, those choosing the Education Specialist Instruction shortage area may be pursuing a Speech-Language Pathology Services Credential in Language, Speech and Hearing or Language, Speech and Hearing and Audiology with a Special Class Authorization\* or a Clinical or Rehabilitative Services Credential in Language, Speech, and Hearing with a Special Class Authorization\* or an Adapted Physical Education Specialist Credential.

\*These documents are service credentials for speech therapy and do not qualify unless the special class authorization is noted on the document.

## APPLICANT SELECTION

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**Institutions should allow all eligible juniors, seniors and credential/graduate program students to submit applications, if they meet the APLE eligibility criteria.**

Institutions may develop their own selection criteria and procedures. Selection criteria should not be so restrictive that the initial allocation cannot be met.

The APLE guidelines require that in addition to meeting the eligibility criteria, selected applicants must be judged by the institution as having outstanding ability on the basis of criteria that may include, but need not be limited to, the following:

- ◆ grade point average
- ◆ test scores
- ◆ faculty recommendation
- ◆ interviews
- ◆ other recommendations

Coordinators should notify students of their institution's selection criteria, procedures, and all application deadlines.

After all applications and LAA's are reviewed for accuracy and completeness, the Coordinators must list each selected applicant's name, social security number, and teaching service area on the reverse side of the Application and the Selection Summary Sheet. The same steps must be taken for the applications and LAA's submitted for potential reallocation, using the Reallocation Summary Sheet.

## SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS

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Coordinators must submit all of the following documents:

- ◆ 2009-2010 Application and Selection Summary Sheet(s)
- ◆ APLE Application and Loan Assumption Agreement for each applicant listed on the summary sheet(s)
- ◆ Reallocation Summary Sheet (if applicable)

The applicant **must** sign and return the Loan Assumption Agreement to the Commission to be certified as a participant in the APLE. Applicants who do not return the LAA will not be eligible to participate. To assist schools in meeting their designated APLE application allocation, the Commission will mail a quarterly report listing participants at each institution.

## REALLOCATION OF UNUSED APPLICATIONS

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Expediting the reallocation process: If your institution utilizes its entire initial allocation and indicates additional need, you must submit a complete application for each of the additional applicants and a Reallocation Summary Sheet.

Applications submitted with the Reallocation Summary Sheet may also be used to replace ineligible applications submitted through the initial allocation process. All reallocated applications will be selected based on the priority listing indicated on the Reallocation Summary Sheet.
