



# Cal Grant

## Transfer Entitlement Program

The Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement Award is for students who were not awarded a High School Entitlement Award but are now transferring from a California Community College to an eligible bachelor degree granting institution in California.

Award requirements include:

- Filing of a [FAFSA](#) or [California Dream Act Application](#) by March 2<sup>nd</sup> of award year
- Meeting financial eligibility and basic eligibility
- Being under the age of 28
- Having a verified GPA electronically reported from a California Community College of 2.4 reported by March 2 of award year.
- Completion of the Transfer Entitlement Verification Form on [WebGrants 4 Students](#)
- Graduation from a California high school after June 30, 2000; and have
- California residency at the time of high school graduation **OR**
- If not a high school graduate, was a California resident on 18<sup>th</sup> birthday

Cal Grant A assists with tuition and fees at public and independent colleges, and some occupational and career colleges. At the University of California and the California State University, the award covers up to full system-wide fees. Your coursework must be for at least two academic years.

Cal Grant B provides a living allowance and tuition and fee assistance at public and independent colleges, and some occupational and career colleges. The awards for tuition and fees are the same as those for Cal Grant A. Your coursework must be for at least one academic year.
