

## **Letter to new Cal Grant recipients attending a SB 70 affected institution.**

RE: Cal Grant Additional Action Needed

Dear Student:

The California Student Aid Commission (Commission) has received your 2011-12 Cal Grant application and has determined that the school listed as your first choice on the FAFSA is not an eligible Cal Grant school. A new California law restricts Cal Grant payments to schools, such as the one you listed, that have high student loan default rates. However, you MAY be eligible to receive a Cal Grant Award for the 2011-12 academic year IF you choose an eligible Cal Grant school for the fall term.

If you wish to preserve your potential Cal Grant award, you will need to take additional steps. Failure to take action within 30 days may result in a delay or the inability to process your application for a Cal Grant award for this academic year.

To activate your potential Cal Grant award at an eligible institution, you must report a School Change to the Commission. To report a School Change:

Log-in to WebGrants for Students (WGS) at [www.webgrants4students.org](http://www.webgrants4students.org) and click the link that says, "Submit School Change." If this is your first time visiting WGS, you will need to create a WGS account by clicking the link that says, "Create an Account." Select an eligible Cal Grant school from the drop down list under the, "School Change To" section. Please click on the "submit change" box to process the school change.
