





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SUBJECT: 2014-15 Cal Grant GPA Verification for Colleges

This Operations Memo provides information for financial aid and registrar staff who submit grade point average (GPA) verifications on behalf of students who are applying to the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) for 2014-15 Cal Grant program awards. Please review the "[GPA Calculation Instructions](#)" and the "[Questions and Answers for Colleges](#)" for details on preparing the GPAs for your students. **The 2014-15 GPA submission deadline is March 3*, 2014.**

**Due to March 2, 2014 falling on a Sunday, the deadline extends to the next business day, Monday, March 3, 2014.*

Electronic GPA Submission

The Commission is now accepting GPA uploads from schools for the 2014-15 academic year Cal Grant awards. The WebGrants GPA function provides immediate feedback regarding the number of GPAs accepted and identifies errors in the upload. Electronic GPA submission is secure, fast, and minimizes errors.

Using the electronic upload option increases the probability that more of your eligible students will receive a Cal Grant award. Since these GPAs are certified electronically, there is no need to fax or mail a paper GPA form.

We strongly encourage all schools to upload GPAs electronically. This allows immediate confirmation that the GPAs were accepted and enables students to immediately view their submitted GPAs through [WebGrants 4 Students](#).

Schools can use WebGrants to directly key a high school or college GPA into the Commission's system, but must be sure to identify the type of GPA. In contrast to completing multiple paper forms, directly keying GPAs on WebGrants is quicker, more secure, and saves the student or school the cost of postage for mailing the paper form.

The *Add GPAs* screen in WebGrants has been enhanced to support a more user friendly process, and it also allows schools to provide the Statewide Student Identifier (SSID) which is used to help match the GPA to the student's Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application.



Prior to submitting GPAs, review the GPA submission procedures to ensure that your upload will be accepted by the Commission. The GPA Upload File specifications have changed from last year with the addition of the Statewide Student Identifier field. Failure to check that the Commission has received the GPA upload may result in students not being considered for a Cal Grant award.

WebGrants 4 Students Website and Contacting the Commission

WebGrants 4 Students (WGS) provides students with their Cal Grant information and allows them to manage their Cal Grant account online. Students can view WGS to see if the Commission has received their GPA and FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application and to identify missing information. Students offered a Cal Grant can update their information, including school changes to transfer their award to their school of choice.
