

Ineligible Cal Grant Schools for 2015-16

(37 Total Ineligible Schools)

Cal Grant participating colleges, universities, and career technical schools must meet various eligibility requirements in law to be able to receive Cal Grants. The two required thresholds* for the 2015-16 academic year are:

1. Schools must keep their federal student loan Cohort Default Rate (CDR) below 15.5 percent.

2. Schools must keep their graduation rate above 20 percent.
