






## What is the California Dream Act Application?

- The California Dream Act Application, often referred to as the CADAA, allows qualified undocumented and nonresident students (US citizens and eligible non-citizens) to receive certain types of financial aid in the State of California
- The CADAA is administered by the California Student Aid Commission



## Who Can Apply?

- Undocumented Students
- With or without DACA
- TPS Status
- U Visa Holders

## Additional Requirements

- Must be eligible to submit the nonresident tuition exemption
- Males 18-25 yrs. old must register for Selective Service

## California Dream Act Application





Only **Temporary Protected Status** (TPS) holders or **U Visa**holders are eligible for AB 540:

# Non-Immigrant Visas & Temporary Protected Status

- TPS or U Visa holders should file CADAA
- T Visa holders should file FAFSA
- Countries with TPS status can change




## **DACA** and Financial Aid

• DACA **is not** required to qualify for non-resident tuition exemption

 DACA <u>is not</u> required to complete CA Dream Act application

 DACA <u>will not</u> impact the ability for students to continue receiving financial aid

The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) will process this application. Any aid offered can only be used at eligible California institutions. The information on this form will be used to determine eligibility in the Cal Grant program. Ask your college whether they will be using this application for financial aid programs other than the Cal Grant program. The California Dream Act Application can be completed online at www.caldreamect.org

The California Dream Act Application is not an application for federal financial aid. Students eligible to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASSA), must use that application which is available online at www.fisha.gov. Students should not complete both applications.

1. Questions with an asterisk (\*) require an answer.

2. If it is determined that you are a DEPENDENT student, your parent will be required to sign the application. Anytime you make a change to your application, your parent will be required to sign. Failure to provide a parent signature, will leave your application incomplete. Your college/university cannot award you financial aid if your application is incomplete.


- 3. Save your application periodically. Sessions expire every 30 minutes. To prevent loss of application and information SAVE your application often.
- 4. The red text throughout the CA Dream Act Application means further action is required from you.
- 5. Based on your answers to questions, this application may skip questions that are not required.
- 6. Do not use your web browser's BACK or FORWARD buttons. Using the web browser back or forward button will cause data to be lost. To prevent loss of data you should use the NEXT and PREVIOUS buttons at the bottom of each page. Remember to save often.
- 7. Make sure you submit your application when complete. Saving your application is not the same as submitting your application. Only submitted applications can be processed for financial aid.
- 8. If you need to make changes or corrections after submitting your application, you must wait at least 24 hours.
- You will see help screens pop up throughout the application. View full line by line instructions on the 2020-21 application.
- 10. You do not have to file taxes to complete the application. However, you can use your 2018 taxes to complete the 2020-21 CA Dream Act Application.


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In the student section, it is critical that students spells their name correctly and provides the correct address and date of birth.




Students should use a non-school or district e-mail address such as a GMAIL e-mail. Students should avoid using a 'family' e-mail if possible.





- Students are required to indicate their high school completion status or its equivalent before beginning the COLLEGE academic year
- They can choose from the following: High school diploma General Educational Development (GED) certificate Home schooled or None of the above
- Almost all High School seniors should choose High School





Students can list up to 10 colleges on the application initially. It does not matter in what order schools are listed, but we suggest listing at least one school from each segment.

These dependency questions are used to determine whether students are dependent or independent for the purposes of calculating an EFC.


Most high school seniors will answer "No" to all of these questions and be considered dependent students for the purposes of financial aid consideration.


## What if the Student's Parents live in Another Country?



- Even if parents live in another country, they are required to provide their income and assets
- When that is not possible because, for example, there Is no contact, students should complete the application as much as they can and then contact your college's financial aid office (FAO) as soon as possible
- The FAO will evaluate the situation and inform the student if they can override the need for parent information
