

Financial Aid Completion Effort in California: Resources for K-12 Schools, Districts, and County Offices of Education July 2022

As of January 2022 there is a new financial aid application completion requirement for local educational agencies (high schools, school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools) to ensure that their seniors are completing and submitting the FAFSA or CADAA beginning October 1, 2022, or opting-out.
