SUBJECT: Middle Class Scholarship - Update

This memorandum provides information on the Middle Class Scholarship (MCS) award processing and notification. As noted in Cal Grant Special Alert (GSA) <u>GSA 2014-23</u> dated July 31, 2014, the submission of MCS enrollment data to the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) was completed on September 2, 2014. The Commission is currently in the process of reviewing the submitted data in preparation for completing the MCS award process and notifying eligible students of their MCS award.

Eligibility Determination


The MCS provides a scholarship for new and continuing undergraduate students with family incomes up to \$150,000 attending the University of California (UC) or the California State University (CSU) who are not already receiving federal, state or institutional grants that exceed 40% of the charged mandatory system-wide tuition/fee amount. For a detailed description of student eligibility and an example of an award calculation, please refer to GSA 2014-23.

Award Notifications

Students attending a UC or CSU campus that are determined to be eligible to receive an MCS award will be notified on Monday, September 15, 2014. Students will receive an email notification instructing them to log in to their WebGrants for Students (WGS) account. Once they have logged in to WGS, they'll be able to retrieve their Middle Class Scholarship California Aid Report (MCSCAR). The MCSCAR will provide the following information for each student: first and last name, address, CSAC ID number, 2014-15 MCS award amount, and school of attendance. Instructions are provided to the student on the MCSCAR as to who they should contact should any of the information appear to be incorrect, such as school of attendance. A copy of the MCSCAR is attached to this memo.

WebGrants for Students Access


Beginning Monday, September 15, 2014 students will also be able to access their award information on WGS through the home page.




After selecting the Middle Class Scholarship link, students can select "View My MCS Award Detail"



Next, clicking "GO!" will take the student to the "Middle Class Scholarship Award Detail" screen.




Once they are on this screen, a student will be able to see their annual MCS award amount, their award amount per term, school of attendance, and federal, state and Institutional aid as reported by their campus. Students that were not awarded due to financial eligibility reasons will see this notated in the "Award Status".




WebGrants Access


Campus and Commission staff will have the ability to view a student's award status through the "MCS Student Award Summary" screen. To access this screen, select the Middle Class Scholarship link from the portal menu.




Next, select the "MCS - Student Info" link.




Select "Student Award Summary"



Students can be searched by SSN or CSAC ID number. After entering the student's information, click "Search".



The "MCS Student Award Summary" screen will populate.



Payment Processing and Correction Submission Timeline

MCS WebGrants functionality is being rolled out in phases. The first phase, discussed above, will notify students of their award and allow for student information to be viewed through WebGrants and WGS. Below is a timeline of the remaining releases and the increased functionality associated with each release.

Monday, September 22, 2014

- MCS Payment File (download report) will be available through WebGrants
- MCS Award Roster (read-only)
- MCS Payment File Processing Testing Period. Campuses will be able to upload payment files to test the payment file process during the week of September 22, 2014.

Monday, September 29, 2014

- MCS Award Roster will be made available with limited functionality (payment transactions only)
- Payment transactions may also be uploaded through the batch file upload process
- Commission will process all payment transactions at the end of the week

NOTE: Once the initial payment transactions have been submitted, the Commission will submit the information to the State Controller's Office the following week. Delivery of funds to each campus should mirror the timeframe for Cal Grant funds delivery.

Monday, October 6, 2014

- "Student History Screen" will be available in WebGrants tracking student payment history
- Campuses will be able to download reports for their MCS payment processing

Monday, October 13, 2014

- Campuses may begin to submit additional enrollment files as well as continue submission of payment files.
- School changes will be allowed. (Details on how to complete a school change will be addressed within the MCS Payment Guide)

Monday, October 20, 2014

• Campuses will be able to submit eligibility changes and adjustment codes utilizing both the batch file upload process and the on-line roster.

The Commission is in the process of developing an MCS Payment Guide which will be made available to campus staff to assist with processing payments. The guide will contain instructions as well as tips on how to handle different scenarios. Once the Correction Process has been implemented, the Payment Guide will be updated to capture both Payment and Correction Processing.

Congratulations! The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) has determined you are eligible to receive a 2014-15 Middle Class Scholarship (MCS) award! The MCS program will offset some of the mandatory system-wide tuition and fee charges for eligible CSU and UC undergraduate students with family incomes up to and including \$150,000.

The scholarship offer is based on the self-reported information from your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Dream Application (DA) and your pertinent, need-based financial aid as reported by your campus. Your MCS amount may be adjusted or withdrawn based on the final eligibility determination made by your campus.
