CA Dream Act Overview

**AB 540 –
2001**

- Allows non-resident students to pay in-state fees

**AB 130 –
July 2011**

- Private Scholarships can be administered by public institutions

**AB 131 –
October 2011**

- State funded grants including Cal Grants and institutional grants

Assembly Bill (AB) 540 (Firebaugh, 2001)



- Created the first state authorized benefit for undocumented students in California – exemption from non-resident tuition at public postsecondary institutions
- Criteria:
 - Attended a CA high school for 3+ years
 - Graduated from a CA high school or the equivalent
 - Enrolls in a public CA college or university
 - If the student is without lawful immigration status, student must file an affidavit with the institution stating that he/she has filed an application to legalize status or will file as soon as eligible

AB 540 Students may be:

Students who are undocumented

Students who are U.S. citizens, but who are not CA residents

- Usually dependent students living in the state whose parents are not CA residents
- Sometimes former CA residents

In any case, the students must meet the AB 540 criteria on the previous slide

AB 540 Students are not:

Students with a Non-immigrant Visa status other than T or U*.

- Non-immigrants, as defined by federal immigration law, may hold one of the following visas: A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, TN, TD, V, TROV and NATO.

*T and U visa holders are eligible under AB 1899.

Students "home-schooled" by a parent who does not hold a CA teacher credential

- a home school does not meet the definition of a "high school in California" as it applies to this exemption eligibility.

AB 540 Students are not:

Students living out-of-state and enrolling in a private California "internet high school"

- Course work completed via a distance learning or a correspondence program, does not meet the definition of a "high school in California" as it applies to AB 540 and 131.

Retention of the Affidavit

- Public campuses are doing this already
- Non-public campuses must retain the AB 540 eligible student's affidavit.
- Completion of the affidavit for “T” and “U” visa holders is not required.

Types of Social Security Cards

- All list person's name and number

1. Valid for the following:

- U.S. citizens; and
- People lawfully admitted to the United States on a permanent basis.

2. “Not Valid For Employment.”

Issued to people from other countries:

- Who are lawfully admitted to the United States without work authorization from DHS, but with a valid non-work reason for needing a Social Security number; or
- Who need a number because of a federal law requiring a Social Security number to get a benefit or service

Types of Social Security Cards

3. **“Valid For Work Only With DHS Authorization.”**

Issued to people lawfully admitted to the United States on a temporary basis who have DHS authorization to work.

And this type is issued to students who have filed for Deferred Action.

Dream Act Aid is not Deferred Action (DACA)

CA Dream Act aid is not the same as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) relief

DACA does not confer a new status for students.

Does not affect AB 540 status, *the* criteria used for Dream Act Aid.

Deferred Action Requirements

1. Entry into the U.S. before the age of 16;

2. Five years of continuous residence and actual physical presence in the U.S. since June 15, 2007, and on June 15, 2012;

3. Enrollment in or graduation from high school or other qualifying educational program or obtained GED certificate;

Deferred Action Requirements

4. No convictions for felonies, significant misdemeanors, multiple misdemeanors, and no national security or public safety threats; and

5. At least 15 years of age at the time of application, but not more than 30 years of age on June 15, 2012.

Additionally, these individuals are required to pay a \$465 filing fee to DHS.

Important Information for AB 540 Students

Males 18 to 25 must register with Selective Service for Cal Grant and other state aid

- Do not need an SSN to register
- Selective Service does not share data
- www.sss.gov to download brief form
- Take form to U.S. Post office or register on site, sign and mail

Students and parents residing in the United States file US tax returns, if meet earning threshold

- Many Dream applicants for 2012-13 did file returns (with ITIN) and pay taxes
- May be required by college/university if selected for verification
- The IRS does not share data

AB 130 - Private Scholarships



In effect since January 2012. AB 540 students can apply for & receive private scholarships administered by public schools:



Scholarships funded through private donors
alumni contributions
individual departmental efforts

- 2013-14 application opens January 1, 2013
- Payments start for 2013-14 school year

Not owe a grant repayment or be in default on a student loan	
Not have earned a BA/BS degree	
Not be incarcerated

★ California Dream Act of 2011

The California Dream Act of 2011, authored by Assembly Member Gil Cedillo (Los Angeles), became law through the passage of two Assembly Bills, AB 130 and AB 131.. AB 130 allows students who meet AB 540 criteria (California Education Code 68130.5(a)) to apply for and receive non-state funded scholarships for public colleges and universities. AB 131 allows students who meet AB 540 criteria to apply for and receive state-funded financial aid such as institutional grants, community college fee waivers, Cal Grant and Chafee Grant.

FAFSA Or Dream Application?

Carefully read these statements **before** choosing the application for your situation.

Dream Application

You must submit the DREAM Application if you meet the following conditions:

- I cannot file the FAFSA, and
- I attended at least three full years in a California public or private high school, and
- I graduated from a California high school or attained the equivalent prior to the start of the college term, i.e., passing the GED or California High School Proficiency Exam (CHSPE), and
- If I am without lawful immigration status, I will file an affidavit with the college or university I attend stating that I have filed an application to legalize my immigration status, or will file an application as soon as I am eligible to do so.

The following students are not eligible to file a DREAM application and should contact their campus financial aid department for assistance.

FAFSA

I am a United States citizen, or

I am a U.S. permanent resident with an I-151, I-551, or I-551C (Permanent Resident Card), or

I am in one of the Following Categories:

A person with an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) showing one of the following designations:

Refugee

Asylum Granted

Cuban-Haitian Entrant, Status Pending

Conditional Entrant (valid only if issued before April 1, 1980)

Parolee (You must be paroled into the United States for at least one year and you must be able to provide evidence from the USCIS that you are in the United States for other than a temporary purpose and that you intend to become a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.), or I am a resident of the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia or Republic of Palau






