COVID-19 Student Survey Key Finding

"

I am concerned about being unable to pay rent or other educational expenses. This has added a lot of stress that is distracting me from my academic goals. -Student Survey Respondent

Greatest Concerns for the Class of 2020:

82%

are concerned about taking online classes

73%

are concerned about their personal financial situation

71%

are concerned about financial hardship in their family



Impact of COVID-19 on Summer Enrollment

Public and Private four-year colleges saw modest enrollment growth, community colleges and private colleges declined 6 to 7 percent.

Particularly, Black students had the steepest decline in online- only summer sessions.

FASFA Completion is Down

Year-over-year, FAFSA completions decreased by 4.2 percentage points. 98,924 fewer high school seniors completed FAFSAs by 8/28 compared to last year.
