March 2020: CSAC submits Modernization Proposal

- Simplify/Streamline Aid
- Address Equity/Reduce Eligibility Barriers
- Establish Total Cost of Attendance as affordability benchmark
- Reduce Student Debt
- Maximally leverage Federal, State, Institutional Aid to serve students
- State Budget 2020: effectively suspended this proposal





• CSAC asked to modify March 2020 proposal: no new funds

- Main Policy Changes:
 - Adopt Federal "Expected Family Contribution" (EFC) as primary metric determining student need.
 - Remove eligibility barriers based on age, time out of high school, and GPA.



PROPOSED: CAL GRANT/2

PROPOSED: All eligible 0 EFC students attending a CCC get a stipend.

- No GPA verification required
- Eliminate time out of high school and age requirements
- Application deadline moved back to September 2
- Increases number eligible from 124k to 280k (125% increase)
- If student is not a SWDC, they get a CalGrant/2 stipend.
- If student is a SWDC, they get a SWDC stipend.



CAL GRANT/2: COSTS AND OPTIONS

Option 1

- Reduce stipend amount, keep existing funding constant.
 - Each student gets ~\$1,250 (less than existing \$1,656, but many more recipients.)

Option 2

- Continue running lottery/first-come, first-served, keeping existing stipend amount constant (\$1,656).
 - ~75% of the eligible pool would receive a stipend of \$1,656.

PROPOSED: SWDC GRANTS

PROPOSED: All eligible SWDC 0 EFC students get a stipend.

- Includes CCC, CSU and UC students (almost all are CCC).
- ~28% of all 0 EFC students in CCC are SWDC.
- CCC student would get either a SWDC grant or a CG/2, but not both.
- SWDC stipend: ~\$2800 (or whatever is portioned from the total SWDC pot).



CAL GRANT/4

PROPOSED: If you are eligible to receive a Pell Grant, you are eligible for a Cal Grant/4 to cover tuition/fees.

- No age/time out of HS requirements.
- GPA cutoff lowered from 3.0 to 2.0.

COSTS:

Proposal cost estimate: \$2.144b (would need \$12m/yr more).



MIDDLE CLASS SCHOLARSHIP (MCS)

PROPOSED: MCS awards would be a fixed amount. The "floor" MCS eligibility point would begin where the upper boundary of the Cal Grant/4 would end.

If you are <u>not</u> eligible for Pell, you <u>are</u> eligible for a Middle Class Scholarship.

- Convert MCS to EFC-based eligibility (in line with proposed CG/2 and CG/4 eligibility criteria).
- Eliminate MCS as a "last dollar award".
- Award MCS from lower to higher EFC until funds exhaust.

MCS OPTION 2: FIXED MCS AWARD FOR ALL

 Make all MCS awards a single, fixed amount for each recipient, regardless of segment, e.g.:

• All paid MCS awards are \$2,000: 58,500 awards

• All paid MCS awards are **\$1,500**: 78,000 awards

• All paid MCS awards are **\$1,000**: 117,000 awards



MCS OPTION 3: VARIABLE MCS AWARD BASED ON EFC

• Make MCS awards taper to EFC ranges, regardless of segment, e.g.:

• EFC is **between 100-150%** Pell EFC: \$2,000 MCS award

• EFC is **between 150-200%** Pell EFC: \$1,500 MCS award

• EFC is above 200% Pell EFC: \$1,000 MCS award
