

# Ineligible Cal Grant Schools for 2022-23

(19 Total Ineligible Schools)

Cal Grant participating colleges, universities, and career technical schools must meet various eligibility requirements in law to be able to receive Cal Grants. The two required thresholds\* for the 2022-23 academic year are:

**1. Schools must keep their federal student loan Cohort Default Rate (CDR) below 15.5 percent.**

**2. Schools must keep their graduation rate above 30 percent.**

Schools on this Ineligible Cal Grant Schools list did not meet one or both of the required thresholds for the 2022-23 academic year.

This list does not include ineligible institutions that are ineligible this year and have been ineligible for the prior two years or longer.
