Are you in a Mixed Status Family & Struggling to File your First FAFSA?



WHAT is this for?

The California Aid Commission (CSAC) has opened the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) for FAFSA-eligible students from mixed status families who are unable to complete the contributor's verification portion of their first FAFSA.

WHO is qualified?

You are in a mixed status family:

You are a US citizen or eligible noncitizen, but one of your FAF-SA contributors does not have a Social Security Number (SSN.)

You are a first time FAFSA applicant:

You have never submitted a FAF-SA or CADAA application before to apply for financial aid.

HOW does this help me??

If you are having issues with FAF-SA, submitting a CADAA now will allow you to:

- Lock in your application submission date to meet the May 2 priority deadline.
- Receive preliminary financial aid award letters to make an informed decision on which college to select before the intent to register deadline.

You can then complete your FAFSA later to access additional federal financial aid.

4 STEPS FOR STUDENTS



Attempt to complete the FAFSA first-- If you're experiencing difficulties due to your contributor not having a Social Security Number (SSN), go to step 2.



Complete the CADAA now to receive a preliminary financial aid award letter.



Complete the FAFSA

later once the application issues are resolved if you want to maximize your federal financial aid eligibility.



If you complete FAFSA,

follow up with your college financial aid office to make sure your financial aid records are linked together.
