#### SUBJECT: 2022-23 Competitive Cal Grant Awards - 100% Paid Rate

This Special Alert from the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) provides an update on the Competitive Cal Grant A and B awards. As announced in <u>GSA 2023-17</u>, the Commission was very close to reaching a 100% paid rate, and as of May 8, 2023, all 13,000 authorized 2022-23 competitive awards have been paid.

Institutions must refrain from posting payments to new 2022-23 competitive awardees unless a prior payment transaction already exists for the student in the current year. This includes students who currently have other adjustment reason codes posted such as Leave of Absence (LA) or Less than Half-Time Enrollment (LH). These transactions can remain as LA or LH, but schools must refrain from posting payments.

Any unauthorized payments to new 2022-23 competitive students posted from this point forward, will be backed out by the Commission and the Financial Aid Office will be notified accordingly.

Thank you for your support and efforts to maximize the utilization of all available Competitive Cal Grant awards for the 2022-23 academic year.

- As of May 8, 2023, all 13,000 2022-23
   Competitive Cal Grant awards have been paid
- Earliest in the academic year that CSAC has reached 100%
- Institutions must refrain from posting payments to new 2022-23 competitive awardees unless a prior payment transaction already exists for the student in the current year.









## Proposed Cal Grant Program Changes

- Would make an additional 150,000 students eligible for aid starting in 2024-25. This would include about 109,000 community college students who would become newly eligible for awards to cover nontuition expenses like food and housing
- A GPA requirement would no longer be required for community college students
- Cal Grant would consist of just two awards: One for community college students and one for four-year students
- 2022-23 budget would include \$500,000 for CSAC to begin implementing the Cal Grant changes

**NOTE:** Changes will only happen if there is enough revenue in 2024-25 to support the changes

## Cal Grant Reform – Financial Eligibility

#### **Current Cal Grant**

- Income ceilings for A & B
  - Dependent & Independent
- Asset ceilings for A & B
  - Dependent & Independent
- Minimum financial need

### **New Cal Grant**

Alignment to the new federal aid methodology by:

- Proportion of Federal Poverty Line by household type
- Align to the new minimum Pell eligibility cutoffs
- Minimum financial need using the Student Aid Index



## The Better FAFSA and CADAA Enhancements for 2024-25 Applications

## What to expect for the 2024-25 FAFSA:

- Is expected to be released December 2023
- 108 questions reduced to 36 questions
- Will be available in the 11 most common languages spoken in the U.S.
- Will allow up to 20 colleges to be listed on the form, up from 10
- Gender and Race questions have been removed
- The FSA ID will be required, with a mechanism for parents who do not have a Social Security Number

## What to expect for the 2024-25 CADAA:

- Is expected to be released December 2023, if not earlier
- Will not be reduced to 36 questions because application does not have access to automatically transfer data from the IRS
- Enhancements based on the recommendations from CADAA Workgroup

SUBJECT: California Chafee Grant for Foster Youth - EFT Now Live

The California Student Aid Commission (Commission) is pleased to announce the launch of Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) for the California Chafee Grant for Foster Youth (Chafee), as outlined in GSA 2023-03.

#### Official Launch Date

Chafee EFT went live on Tuesday, May 2, 2023. Any payment requests after this date will be delivered electronically to the institutions that opted-in to receive Chafee EFT.

As a reminder, institutions should update their cash management policy to include how Chafee EFT funds will be handled internally since the institutional office that receives Chafee funds may change.

Institutions who opted-out of Chafee EFT will continue to receive paper warrants by mail.

#### **Update EFT Preference**

Institutions who are not yet participating in Chafee EFT may opt-in at any time by emailing <a href="mailto:chafee@csac.ca.gov">chafee@csac.ca.gov</a>.

## CALIFORNIA CHAFEE GRANT FOR FOSTER YOUTH

#### Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) Implementation

The California Student Aid Commission (Commission) is pleased to announce the implementation of Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) for the Chafee Grant, as announced in **GSA 2023-03**.

#### Benefits of EFT

- Faster receipt of funds for reconciled Chafee accounts
- One-time Chafee verification
- Secure transfer of Chafee funds
- Quicker access of funds by students
- Elimination of stop payment and check reissue requests
- · Reduction of manual processing of paper warrants

#### **EFT Email Notification**

Institutions will certify students' eligibility and request payments in WebGrants. The payment process will occur Monday night and institutions will receive funds in their designated bank account by Friday.

The Chafee Program Coordinator, Fiscal Officer, and EFT Coordinator will receive an email notification of their EFT two days in advance of deposits that will include a unique Claim Schedule Number.

Institutions that would like to add additional contacts to receive the EFT email notification, email chafee@csac.ca.gov
. Please keep in mind that these contacts would also receive email notifications for all EFT communications.

#### **Identifying Students' Payments**

Once an institution receives notification of Chafee EFT funds, the Chafee Coordinator may utilize the "Recipients per Claim Schedule on the "Institution Reconciliation" screen in WebGrants to determine which students' payments were included. Please refer to the Chafee Payment Roster Quick User Guide on our Chafee Grant homepage for additional step by step instructions

#### How to Return Funds via EFT

Institutions must promptly return unused Chafee funds to the Commission throughout the academic year. The two options for returning EFT funds are:



## Cal Grant Institutional Participation Agreement

- •The IPA is a binding contract between the college and the Commission.
- •The new 4-year Cal Grant IPA: 2023-27. All documents must be submitted by **May 31, 2023.**
- •The IPA is used for initial participation, renewal or updates.
- •Eligible institutions with a valid Cal Grant IPA are placed on the CSAC Eligible Schools List.
