The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) is still processing applications for Cal Grant C program eligibility. To determine your program eligibility, the Commission needs additional information. Please complete the enclosed Cal Grant C Supplement Form (Supplement) and return it as soon as possible to receive further consideration. You may submit your Supplement by Fax or scan the Supplement as a PDF file and email the copy to the Commission. The recommended method is to scan and email your Cal Grant C Supplement Form to the Commission for processing.

If mailing this form, we suggest you keep a photocopy, obtain a U.S Postal Service Certificate of Mailing, and return it to the Commission as soon as possible.

Participation in Cal Grant C is limited to students who are either enrolled or planning to enroll in a recognized vocational/technical/occupational program of at least four months in length, during the 2018-19 academic year. Students directly pursuing a four-year degree, graduate study course, prerequisites or general education courses are not eligible.

As you pursue your vocational/technical/occupational program, it is never too early to start thinking about jobs after you graduate from school. The Commission has partnered with the Employment Development Department (EDD) and local workforce investment boards to provide valuable tools to assist you in launching your career after you have earned your certificate or degree. Job seekers can take advantage of a variety of comprehensive services and programs at no cost, such as job search and placement services.

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The following information is provided to help students complete the Cal grant C Supplement (Supplement). Please read the directions carefully and type or print your answers and fill in the appropriate ovals using blue or black ink. Your answers will be used to determine your Cal Grant C eligibility. Before mailing the Supplement, please check all of your answers carefully. If you submit an application with a mistake, you will not be able to correct it.

## 1 - 5. Student Information

Please complete all questions in this section.

## 6. Standard Occupational Classification (SOC)

Please review the occupational codes listed on the cover letter provided with this Supplement. You should list the occupational code that you will be working toward during the 2016-17 school year. Write in the code in the boxes provided for on question 7. If your occupation code is not listed, write in "00-0000" and write the name of the current occupational goal on line 7a. Do not list future occupational goals.

## 7. Educational Plans

In question 8a, fill in the total length of your occupational/technical program. Total length includes coursework that you have already completed. Indicate the name of the school you will be attending on line 8b. To be eligible for payment, the total length of a vocational program must be at least four months. Cal Grant C benefits cannot be paid to students in four-year degree, general education, or graduate programs, or to those taking course prerequisites for enrollment into a vocational program.

## 8. Work History

Fill in the oval that represents the total number of combined months you have worked in a paid, unpaid, and/or voluntary work experience.

## 9. Educational History

Fill in the oval that represents the total number of occupational/technical courses for which you have both completed and received academic credit. Include courses taken in high school, Regional Occupational Program (ROP), work experience, college courses and courses taken while in the military.

## 10. Unemployment History

Respond to whether or not you were unemployed for 6 months or more, at the time you submitted your FAFSA or CA Dream Act application.
