GDSM Champion Meeting Resumes through May

GDSM Champion meetings resumed on February 25th, 2021. The GDSM Champion meetings are critical in ensuring the needs of users for each institution have the information and support they need for a smooth transition. A GDSM Champion is a representative from each institution who works with the CSAC GDSM Project to prepare their institutional users for the transition to the new look and feel of the Web Grants for Institutions interface.

February meeting: Marlene Garcia, the CSAC Executive Director opened the meeting to kick-off preparations for the release of WebGrants for Institutions and CADAA to the new unified platform. The agenda included training, support, and preparations by institutions for implementation.

A fruitful Q&A session followed. Key questions are included in the section below.

Q&A Results

Upon request of the GDSM Champions, CSAC IT Department, Training and Support are working on a checklist to assist Champions in preparing institutions for the change. Once complete a link to the checklist will be made available.

We hope the following questions and answers are also helpful:

- Q: What do we need for the first-time login process?
 A: Login instructions will be provided prior to release. We are preparing a video.
- Q: What date are you planning to launch so we can complete critical work as much as possible prior to release?
 - A: End of April at the earliest is our target right now. This should allow institutions to complete critical work prior to release.
- Q: Will you be decommissioning the legacy system upon implementation?
 A: No. We will still be leveraging some of the structure in the old system. The database is still largely the same. Data, data model, and logic from the legacy system will persist.
- Q: What about a roll-back (back-up) plan in case something goes wrong?
 A: We will be able to roll back if we find critical unexpected issues after going live with GDSM.
- Q: Is your training now on the new system.
 A: Our current training materials are on the legacy system. We will have training on the new system for the roll-out and going forward.
- Q: Can the campus send in a test file?
 A: It is not necessary. The data structure remains constant. We are testing all the data exchanges internally multiple times with multiple files.
- Q: Will meetings continue after the roll-out?
 A: Yes. The format may change for the quarterly releases where enhancements will be addressed.

Training

Re-establishing your login is required once the WebGrants 4 Institutions is transitioned to the new platform. The training team will be providing the login information toward the end of March. You will be notified once the instructions are available.

An eLearning library will be available with course modules such as the Cal Grant Overview, Uploading High School GPAs and more. These modules include interactive features to ensure understanding of the material. They are available on-demand, so you will not have to wait for an upcoming webinar to learn more about the specific topic. These trainings will include updated screenshots of the new system. As new enhancements are released, additional trainings will be added to ensure understanding of the improved processes. In addition to the eLearning library, CSAC will continue to offer live webinars and eventually, per health and safety guidelines, in person trainings.
