This Operations Memo from the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) provides an update on the processing of the 2018-19 Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement and March 2 Competitive awards.

### **2018-19 Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement Awards**

- The Commission has identified and sent notifications to **29,710** applicants with potential eligibility for the CCC Transfer Entitlement Award.
  - Potentially eligible applicants for the 2018-19 Transfer Entitlement Award will continue to be processed on a weekly basis throughout the academic year.
- Notified applicants must complete the Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement (G-6) self-certification form by logging into their WebGrants for Students account at [www.webgrants4students.org](http://www.webgrants4students.org)
  - The Commission will continue to process the G-6 self-certification forms on a weekly basis.

### **2018-19 Cal Grant March 2 Competitive Awards**

- Over **174,805** financially eligible applicants were considered for the 12,875 March 2 Competitive awards.
- Applicants with a score of **653** or above were offered a Competitive Cal Grant.
- The scoring matrix for the 2018-19 award year had a maximum possible applicant score of 1000 points. The [current scoring matrix](#) is available on the Commission's website.
  - The 2018-19 scoring matrix was revised to address omission of socioeconomic points due to the skip logic in the Free Application for Federal Student Aid that affected some of the competitive applicants.

- The revised scoring eliminated the disadvantaged indicators category and redistributed 20 points to each of the following categories: household status, parent education level, education access equalizer, and family/environmental indicators.
- Competitive Cal Grant offered awardees have been notified by e-mail and are advised to use [WebGrants4Students.org](http://WebGrants4Students.org) for further information regarding their Cal Grant status.

### **Cal Grant Awardee Details**

- Utilize the *Award Status Extract* process to identify Cal Grant eligible students who are attending your campus.
- Schools may claim their Cal Grant eligible students by submitting a *School Change* upload file.
- View a breakdown of your students' Cal Grant scores by selecting the "Score Detail" button on the *Student Award Detail* screen on WebGrants.
- Additional communications will be sent to eligible students to remind them of their Cal Grant award and steps to take to receive a payment.
