SUBJECT: Opening of 2022-23 Cal Grant GPA Electronic Submission

This Operations Memo from the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) announces the opening of the 2022-23 Electronic Grade Point Average (GPA) submission window.

GPAs for the class of 2022 can be electronically submitted beginning today, **June 24, 2021,** and no later than October 1, 2021, as specified under <u>Education Code 69432.9 (c)(2)</u>, unless the student has opted-out per <u>Education Code 69432.9 (d)(1)(2)</u>. Please refer to <u>GOM 2020-34</u> for additional information on the Opt-Out provision.

- The Commission launched the new WebGrants for Institutions site on May 10, 2021. Please see <u>GSA 2021-16</u> for more information about the new website and first-time login instructions. Verify when your WebGrants access is set to expire and renew if needed. Please visit our WebGrants Access Request <u>webpage</u> for more information, including access forms.
- Online webinar trainings on the GPA upload process will be available throughout the next few months. To register for a live webinar, please visit our Upcoming Webinars webpage.
- Students who are enrolled in summer school should not have their GPAs uploaded until **after** summer school grades have been posted, as these grades should be included in the GPA calculation.
- High schools are **no longer** able to submit GPAs with Social Security Numbers and must use the "Non-SSN GPA" method. Refer to <u>GSA 2018-23</u> for more information.

Keep in mind that high school students have a 2-year window to qualify for a High School Entitlement Cal Grant – as seniors and 1 year after graduation. Therefore, it is a best practice to also submit GPAs for your 2021 graduates, given that some students would benefit from having their GPAs recalculated using grades earned during senior year.
