SUBJECT: Class of 2024 Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out Requirement

This Operations Memo from the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) reminds school districts and charter schools of the annual requirement under California Education Code section 69432.9 subsection (d)(1), to provide an opportunity for students in 11th grade (and for minors, their parents/guardians), to Opt-Out of being automatically considered as a Cal Grant applicant. Notification to Opt-Out of the Cal Grant program should be sent by high schools to students in writing, and no later than **January 1st** of a student's junior year.

To ensure the January 1st Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out notification date is met each year, it is imperative that school districts and charter schools create a process for deciding when and how to notify their juniors of the Opt-Out provision.

Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out notifications should have the following dates:

- Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out deadline no less than 30 days should be given for students and parents to Opt-Out.
- **GPA submission date** date the school/district will upload GPAs to the Commission.
- **GPA submission deadline** October 1 (applies to public and charter schools).

The Commission offers a *Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out Form* in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>, which may be used as part of a school's Opt-Out process. Forms should be retained at the school level and should not be sent to the Commission. Should the Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out form <u>not</u> be received by the date stated on the form, it is understood that the student has agreed to have their GPA submitted for Cal Grant consideration.
