SUBJECT: **Reminder: 2017-18 Cal Grant and Middle Class Scholarship Year-End Reconciliation**

This Special Alert from the California Student Aid Commission (Commission) provides an update to [GSA 2018-16](#) regarding the September 6, 2018 year-end reconciliation deadline for the 2017-18 Cal Grant and Middle Class scholarship (MCS) programs.

The following deadlines will allow the Commission and institutions to adequately prepare for the October 1 opening of the 2019-20 application period:

<p>June 29, 2018 by 5:00 p.m. PST</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deadline for students to submit a new 2017-18 CA Dream Act Application. • Deadline for institutions to submit Grant Record Changes (G-21) that could result in new awards (first award offer to an eligible student for the 2017-18 academic year). • Deadline for institutions to submit 2017-18 MCS enrollment files. • The last new 2017-18 Cal Grant and MCS awards will be processed after 5:00 p.m. PST.
<p>August 31, 2018 by 5:00 p.m. PST</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deadline to make corrections to submitted 2017-18 CA Dream Act Applications. • Deadline for institutions to submit school-change upload files (moves an awarded student from one campus roster to another).
<p>September 6, 2018 by 5:00 p.m. PST</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deadline for institutions to submit Grant Roster payment files. • All 2017-18 roster transactions, including payments or payment adjustments must be completed in WebGrants before 5:00 p.m.

Schools are encouraged to reconcile their payment rosters monthly to effectively complete final year-end reconciliation by September 6, 2018.
